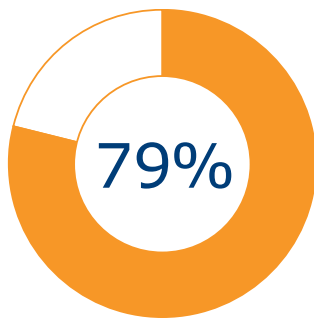
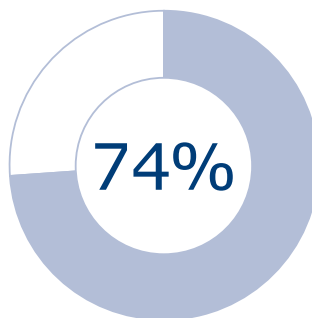

IWLA WLP Program Tiers

Tier I - Qualified Warehouse Logistics Professional (QWLP)

This level is especially for emerging logistics professionals who are ready to make a career in the industry. *\$250 application fee.*

Tier II - Certified Warehouse Logistics Professional (CWLP)

This designation is for more seasoned individuals who have broad career experience and who have pursued additional professional education. *\$500 application fee.*

Tier III - Executive Warehouse Logistics Professional (EWLP)

The EWLP program is reserved for individuals who have achieved officer-level success in their organizations. *\$1,000 application fee.*
